# Plane's State Jail Dayton, Texas August 19-20

Excited for the opportunity, I lined up along the wall outside the POD. While waiting I was praying. When I looked up and into the POD, my eyes connected with a former Tarrant County Inmate to whom I had ministered some months before. A coincidence? No! Out of 2,500 prisoners, God in His divine plan orchestrated the encounter.

It was 110° inside the POD. Fifty-eight women

were in all manner of dress. Many lay lethargic on their bunks. One large industrial size fan roared pointing in no particular direction, with two smaller fans whirring like the propellers of a helicopter moving little if any air offering a modicum of relief. The air was pungent with body odor. The metal tables and benches bolted to the floor were ar-

ranged in the center of the room and smeared with fingerprints. The bathroom facilities at the back emanated odors that were noxious and assaulting to the nose. The bunks lined the walls grouped in fours. Two long painted wooden benches faced one bank of bunks and the only TV in the room.

Women were sleeping, reading, writing letters, doing hair, crying while a couple of young women had discovered a way in which to color their eyelids using colored pencils. Surprised by the sudden intrusion of their daily boredom, they seemed stunned to find non prisoners in the POD

Marciel had gathered a small group of women and ushered them to a table. She motioned for me to come to her table. No physical contact permitted we could only exchange cordial greetings. Curious about my presence she asked why I had come. To answer her question I shared the full Gospel Message .Two of the young ladies in that gathering prayed to receive Christ. Marciel, a gang ,member and new mother, did not re-

spond but heard the Gospel message again. I noticed the guard hanging close but never interrupting. When the time to move to the next POD came, I was informed that I was <u>only</u> to invite the ladies to the crusade and pray with those who expressed a need.

725 women came to the four services. The worship time was impactful in music, testimony and message. Brad

Gardner, director of Prisoners Bible Institute gave opportunity for women to respond to the message of salvation by a show of hands. Hands went up all over the room. Many abandoned, lonely, disowned women received hope. They came for a variety of reasons and left encouraged, challenged and with God's Word fresh on their minds and hearts. Blowing kisses to the volunteers and mouthing Thank You the women filed out of the Chapel, eyes brimming with tears.
