Marlon goes on to report, "When we called for people who wanted to receive Jesus Christ as their personal Savior, he was the first to come to confess his sins and pray to receive Christ. At the close of the film he came asking for help to grow in the Lord. We invited him to our newly planted church for a time of baptizing and we are happy to report that he came and was baptized on Saturday and is still in the church today! Marlon went on to say: The project was good and fruitful, but there is

TO GOD BE THE GLORY for our partnership with HEM and YOU, which has resulted in 29,784 receiving Christ our Lord! Can you imagine the delight of the Father? Thank you for joining with us to help make this project profitable for the Kingdom of God.

Please read the following report from Randall Jinkins, the leader of the project in Malawi. "This was a rough trip. The Kasunga portion of the trip was fine except for the shortage of fuel. Fuel is priced at \$6.57 a gallon there if you can find it. We never ran out of fuel but were concerned about having



enough to get to Salima. Thankfully, we found fuel in Lilongwe on our way through. Salima was a bit rougher. I do not recommend any human being to go to Salima in October. It is unbearably hot there in October, and I understand even hotter in November, just before the rainy season. I suffered from heat exhaustion on Friday. I was able to hydrate but was unable to replace my electrolytes because they do not have anything like Gatorade. I was able to continue though in a fog. I prayed daily that through my weakness, God would be shown to be strong." God was faithful to His Word and His Work; in spite of the extreme temperature and concern over fuel supply, thousands were introduced to life in Christ.
